



COLOMBIA HELPING GRENADA TO MANAGE HISTORIC CENTERS

ST. GEORGE'S, GRENADA, WEDNESDAY, 23 JULY, 2014 - GIS: A delegation from Grenada is in Colombia to explore best practices in the management of historic centers as part of a week of activities generously supported by Colombia's Foreign Ministry, the Presidential Agency for International Cooperation, and the National Commission for UNESCO.

This latest manifestation of South-South cooperation follows from dialogue between the Hon. Nickolas Steele, Minister for Foreign Affairs and International Business and Parliamentary Representative for the Town of St. George, and his Colombian counterpart Maria Angela Holguin, on the margins of the 44th General Assembly of the OAS held in Paraguay in June.
